
The Active Transportation Plan

CALL FOR POLITICAL ACTION



Concerts Across America became a very large, peaceful protest and organizing effort to end gun violence in our country. Our Mountain Action for Peace & Justice sponsored the Concert Across America/Lake Arrowhead concert on Sunday September 25th. It was one of 350 concerts

across America to remember the victims of gun violence and to call for an end to such violence. There was a literature table with supporting articles and a petition calling for ending loopholes in background checks. Sherry Bailey, Chairperson of the event, spoke on the importance of protecting children, domestic partners and all people from gun violence.

The audience was entertained by Grits & Grady which included two songs by Bob Sherman; John Mc Gill; Highland Pickers and George Barton who ended with a sing along. The event was held at the Tudor House who provided important support for the venue and live streaming.

The local media was supportive with excellent articles in the Mt. News and the Alpenhorn. The Mt. Bear Democratic Club was helpful with publicity and volunteer positions. Thanks! The attendance was less than hoped for.

There were about 40 – 50 attendees over the course of the 3 hours. Some blamed the wind, some the Sunday afternoon slot and some the fact that mountain people don't like political/serious events. Despite the attendance, the event joined in the national campaign to end gun violence, provided widespread education through the media and



made new friends through the organizing. Thank you to everyone who spread the word, attended or helped in any way.

VOTING NEWS

The <u>Supreme Court</u> is now 2-1 for expanding voting rights. A suit was rejected that would have given Ohio even more time to both vote and register, but it also would have gone against the State's intent, and that was deemed unnecessary.

Online registration with Snapchat . . . can online voting be far behind?

"Now you can register to vote in Snapchat," by <u>Mashable's</u> <u>Kerry Flynn</u>: "The mobile storytelling app is running a public service campaign in partnership with nonprofit Democracy Works' TurboVote that encourages voter registration and allows users to check their eligibility and



register all within Snapchat. Any Snapchat user in the U.S. who is 18 and older and therefore eligible to vote can see the video ads between Snapchat Stories and Discover that direct to a voter registration mobile webpage within the app that's powered by TurboVote. The campaign began on Sept. 15 and lasts until Oct. 7."

Every vote counts in this election, and every policy change during the next administration will have repercussions. One repercussion might not be what you expected – the end of the separation of church and state, as <u>Chris</u><u>Hedges explains</u>.

Scott Markovich on Education

Public education funding formulas need to be adjusted for smaller and rural districts. They should reimburse unique costs. For example, the transportation costs of a district like Rim of the World Unified are more than the state reimburses. Rim has to make up the deficit from their general fund. This causes the district to make cuts in other areas. The cost of transportation in urban schools is significantly less, but the state funding formulas are the same for both rural and urban districts. Both are required to get every child to school by mandate.



If I get elected to the state assembly, this will be one of my main objectives. Assembly District 33 has many small rural school districts that need transportation funding addressed fairly to reflect actual costs.


