for the children of our mountain communities. Click on their link for more details on the Rim of the World Educational Foundation.


NEXT MEETING

CALIFORNIA POLITICS

BALLOT PROPOSITION results

Of the 17 propositions, 12 were approved and five were defeated. Here are the results – along with the Democratic Party's endorsed votes. See if your vote aligned with the Democratic Party recommended **VOTE-** in California.

- **-YES-** Prop 51 -YES- Supports the state issuing \$9 billion in bonds to fund improvement and construction of school facilities for K-12 schools and community colleges. A school bond for repairing facilities across the state.
- **-YES-** Prop 52 -YES- Would extend permanently an existing fee imposed on most private hospitals that is scheduled to end Jan. 1, 2018.
- **-NO-** <u>Prop 53</u> **-NO-** Changes the way California funds large projects. If passed, the Legislature will have to hold a statewide referendum (similar to this ballot) to determine if bonds or fees to cover a needed expenditure will be sold or assessed. It puts advertisers, opposing politicians and contractors more deeply into the process for responding to unforeseen crises.
- **-YES-** Prop 54 NO- Causes a delay in legislation and requires televised and internet display of pending legislation. Supported by an influence selling legal firm, conservative coalitions and many demanding a smaller, less effective government.
- **-YES-** Prop 55 -YES- Extends a tax on the largest income tax bracket \$250,000 per individual, \$500,000 per married couple. The money is aimed at essential services primarily education, with a small portion for healthcare.
- **-YES-** Prop 56 Tax increase of \$2.00 per pack on cigarettes. The majority of the money generated would go toward increasing spending on Medi-Cal, the state's health care program for low-income residents.

Ballot Propositions Results (cont.)

- **-YES-** Prop 57 **-YES-** a measure that will encourage nonviolent offenders to use their prison time to improve themselves. Prop. 57 will also put the decision of whether to try a juvenile as an adult in the hands of a judge not a prosecutor.
- **-YES-** Prop 58 **-YES-** would eliminate the English-only mandate. Instead, school districts could adopt any approach they see fit to teaching English learners, as long as they get community input and ensure that all students master the English language.
- **-YES-** Prop 59 **-YES-** asks if voters want the state's elected officials to take steps to try to reverse Citizens United and related cases. Advisory only.
- **-NO-** Prop 60 **-NO-** Once a suit against a movie/scene is filed, the plaintiff would have the right to find those pornstars involved, their real names, their addresses the court would in fact compel the studio to give that information to the plaintive in discovery. Repeats a law in existence.
- **-NO-** Prop 61 **-NO POSITION-** in California would be a major step toward reining in Big Pharma's prices.
- **-NO-** <u>Prop 62</u> <u>-YES-</u> Eliminates the death penalty for incarcerated persons and future convicts in favor of a life sentence without possibility of parole.
- **-YES-** <u>Prop 63</u> **-YES-** Prohibits the possession of large-capacity ammunition magazines and would require a background check in order to purchase ammunition.
- **-YES-** Prop 64 **-YES-** Legalizes the growth and use of marijuana for recreational purposes.
- **-NO-** Prop 65 NO POSITION- Companion legislation to Prop 67 a "no" vote completes a "yes" vote to the ban on single use bags.
- **-YES-** Prop 66 NO- Reinforces and removes safeguards from the existing laws in California regarding the death penalty but keeps it in place.

Ballot Propositions Results (cont.)

-YES- Prop 67 **-YES-** Bag Ban is realized according to voter wishes from 2014.

As of November 15, 2016, support and opposition campaigns had amassed \$494,528,869.72 in contributions. The Los Angeles Times estimated that, between funding signature gathering efforts and campaigning, more than \$452 million would be spent directly on ballot measures in California in 2016.



The campaigns surrounding Proposition 61, an initiative designed to regulate drug prices, had more funding that

those surrounding any other ballot proposition.

Together, the Proposition 61 campaigns had received \$128,098,546.56. Opponents had outraised supporters six-to-one.

A combined total of \$106,783,664.84 had been raised in support of or opposition to Proposition 56, an initiative increasing the tobacco tax.



Campaigns involved in Proposition 52 have received the third largest amount of funding, at a combined total of \$71,846,099.70. This is more or less to be expected, as there is a LOT of money being collected from people quite able to spend extra money on political contributions.

A consumer advocacy group contends that California refiners <u>are holding down gasoline</u> <u>production</u> to inflate prices at the pump. California prices remain at least 50 cents a gallon higher than in other areas of the country even though a major Southland refinery that was mostly shut down throughout 2015 is back in operation, says Santa Monica-based Consumer Watchdog.



BUSINESS AND NATIONAL POLITICS

David Lazarus and the Los Angeles Times reminds us that we have a fast approaching deadline - Congress faces a <u>Friday deadline</u> to pass a bill to keep the government running. Lawmakers failed to pass appropriation legislation before the new fiscal year began Oct. 1, avoiding a government shutdown by approving a temporary spending bill to keep public services operating until next year. Republican leaders want to pass another <u>short-term spending bill</u> to extend existing funding levels into next spring.

This WEDNESDAY is the last day to enroll in Medicare. If your income is too low to qualify for assistance with premiums for an ACA policy, you may be forced into a Medicare policy. DO NOT DELAY checking your income status and find out whether a Covered California plan is available to you. Enrolling in an ACA policy is the best way to resist the GOP and Congress' actions to destroy it. The next best, of course, is to call the offices of your representatives – and whether you like it or not, there are Republicans in office, and they, too, are YOUR representatives, so make them work for their paychecks!

Given the chance, any newspaper (and especially the wholly lacking in integrity TV 'news' industry) would chop every established agency or institution to small bits. So when the FBI was caught playing partisan politics, hacks and anchors alike were REALLY excited. They shouldn't have been, of course – this is more of the historical 'same' as the <u>Denver Post</u> explains. Even <u>Rudi Giuliani's connection to James Comey</u> is not unusual, even if it is too close for most people's comfort.

So like it or not, we've got a <u>Supreme Court</u> that's likely to become slanted toward conservative interpretation, A Congress (even with the <u>unlikely election of a Democrat in Louisiana</u>) that's firmly, if not overwhelmingly, in the hands of the GOP, a President who is so far off the normal political spectrum that he's somewhere between Benito Mussolini and a Banana Republic dictator, and an FBI that is about as reliable as a neighborhood gang in East L.A. The good news is that apparently the FBI is no longer on an active phone line to TV stations and newspapers – only Alex Jones and other similar right wing nut job sites are even pretending to have news.


California ENVIRONMENT

We've been working with our partners to correct an injustice in the San Bernardino Mountains. Nestlé water bottling has been removing tens of millions of gallons of water, bottling it for sale, and raking in Billions in profits. Profits they've used to fight any opposition in the press, by buying off influence, and in the courts. Every 8 million gallons represents the use of about 50 4-member families for a year. Last year, this foreign company removed 28 million gallons in 2015, but only pays \$524 per year. The Nestlé suit in Riverside Federal Court resulted in a decision allowing the removal of water without an updated Environmental Impact Report (EIR). It is being appealed, as this Sentinel article details. The Story of Stuff has created a very well-made video to explain the effect of removing water from Strawberry Creek by a foreign corporation. Share it widely to your friends, family, and influential elected officials.

Billionaire green activist Tom Steyer has promised to resist the antiregulation and environmental policies of the President-Elect, as this <u>Reuters</u> <u>article</u> lays out. Mr. Steyer is also stated to have spent over \$30 Million dollars of his own money to protect the environment (and promote his own candidacy for Governor of California) during this election.

Some pretty disgusting facts about <u>plastics in the oceans from Vox</u> – and don't forget – 8% of all extracted crude oil is either made into or is used to make plastics . . . so Big Oil is pretty much plastic's "Big Brother" in this continuing crime against our planet!

California Environment (cont.)

THE SUPREME COURT AND LAW

This week, the US Supreme Court will <u>hear a case</u> in order to determine whether or not an attempt to restrict the representation of people of color was intended when district lines were drawn in Virginia. Most people wonder "Did you really need a case to figure this out?"

THE PRESIDENT-Elect

Without a doubt, the reaction to the election on November 8th (without regard to party or even whether you voted or not) has been shock. Normalizing the unthinkable (in the case of our President-Elect's unspoken support of white supremacy) would not seem easy on the surface, but the United States of America has a history of <u>doing precisely that</u>. Since 'the media' is for sale to the highest bidder, it will be up to the public to speak clearly about the true issues, and not the <u>fake news</u> being promoted.

So here are some reputable sources to help that discussion along:

Qualifications for the Presidency

Ignorance of international policy and established treaties has been a problem for the President-Elect, even beyond the idiocy of the phone call from Taiwan, a part of China that remains unrecognized as sovereign by the U.S. since the 1970s. That is <u>not expected to happen</u> any more than were the results of the election.

Verifying the Vote

Attempts were made to verify the vote in Florida when GW Bush was declared the victor against then Vice President Al Gore. It was contested hotly all the way to the Supreme Court. This time, many agency big-wigs are proclaiming that <u>Russia had an active hand</u> in this election, and even <u>Green Candidate Jill Stein</u> has petitioned for a review to clear the name of national elections. Even the President-Elect has <u>voiced his confidence</u> in the recorded results.

FURTHER RESOLVED, That there will be no conversion therapy, no withdrawal of rights in San Francisco. We began hosting gay weddings twelve years ago, and we are not stopping now. And to all the LGBTQ people all over the country who feel scared, bullied, or alone: You matter. You are seen; you are loved; and San Francisco will never stop fighting for you; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That we still believe in this nation's founding principle of religious freedom. We do not ban people for their faith. And the only lists we keep are on invitations to come pray together; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That Black Lives Matter in San Francisco, even if they may not in the White House. And guided by President Obama's Task Force on 21st Century Policing, we will continue reforming our police department and rebuilding trust between police and communities of color so all citizens feel safe in their neighborhoods; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That climate change is not a hoax, or a plot by the Chinese. In this city, surrounded by water on three sides, science matters. And we will continue our work on CleanPower, Zero Waste, and everything else we are doing to protect future generations; and, be it
