LAST MEETING

The adopt-a-highway program is moving ahead at the pace of Caltrans. Several sites were chosen for safety and need, and we now wait to be informed when we can get our training and gear and get to cleaning!

Vice President StanHaren reported on the Campaign seminar held July 8th at the Marriott in Hesperia. The Power point Presentation is available to members that request it. The most important point made is that candidates who win have reasons for running that are compelling – and never focused on defeating the incumbent or personal needs.

President Mickey Laws explained the pre-endorsement system and the need for physical addresses to verify active members in good standing. When a Membership Chair was explained and solicited, Jane Haren volunteered, and was appointed by the President with unanimous agreement of those present. The process of the Club endorsing a candidate was explained. At the next meeting members will discuss the process and at the September meeting we will hold a vote to amend the bylaws. An Endorsement Chair and Committee will be needed, and applications or recommendations are solicited.

Mickey and Glen presented a joint report on the SB 562 Town Hall. Copies of the notes taken by Glen are available upon request. There are three stages to the bill – the first (requiring a majority vote in both Chambers of the Legislature) is on the policy – how the workings of a single payer healthcare system are to be defined. The second is the financing (requiring a 2/3 majority vote or a ballot initiative). The third is the necessary change in Prop 98 and make the funds raised from new taxes exempt from the "50% goes to education" clause (also requiring a 2/3 vote, or ballot initiative).

Nestlé lawn signs are now available, and come with a "real estate" wire structure for easy placement. Glen has them almost all the time in his car!

The Unity Picnic at Fairmount Park was recounted, emphasizing Congr. Mark Takano and Penny Newman's willingness to speak at our Club. Both were welcomed by those present.

THE SUPREME COURT AND LAW

"The High Court announced that it will make "virtually all filings" available to the public at no cost. It is part of a new electronic filing system, to be up and running by Nov. 13, 2017, and similar to programs already working in other federal courts." <u>Findlaw blog by William Vogeler, Esq.</u>

In Illinois, there is a case certain to end up on the docket – <u>The Chicago</u> <u>Tribune reports</u>. "For now, Illinois can't enforce a change in state law requiring hospital and medical clinic professionals tell pregnant women about all their available options, including abortion. Seems <u>'Evangelical</u> <u>Doctors'</u> is a real thing.

That's because a federal judge out of Rockford ruled that until a lawsuit over the law is settled, it shouldn't be enforced statewide. The move comes after several <u>Christian clinics filed lawsuits against state officials</u>, maintaining that their free speech and religious freedoms were being violated by an amendment to the state's right-of-conscience law that took effect in January. Doctors and other medical staff at the Christian clinics argue that they would have to give advice they find morally wrong."

In a nation of laws, a loss in court can lead to an even more important victory. Data obtained during the <u>recall case in Wisconsin</u> may well lead to the end of gerrymandering in our country!
